

Nicknamed "Crossroads of the Northeast," junction of Interstate 84 and Interstate 87 (NY State Thruway) City of Newburgh (Orange County's Largest City), Town of Newburgh and New Windsor

Known for: Henry Hudson Expedition 1609, Gen. George Washington's Revolutionary War Headquarters, Newburgh Waterfront Restaurant Row and sightseeing cruises, East End Historic District architecture, Mount St. Mary College, SUNY Orange, Downing Park, New York Stewart International Airport, Umbra Film Studios, Newburgh Brewing Company, Motorcyclepedia, Newburgh Illuminated Festival


Nicknamed The "River City", it's the gateway to New York State's Upper Delaware Scenic Byway (Route 97)
